During the time of the meeting the delegates worked very hard but of course, there was also time for a wonderful free time programme which included an evening with folk music, a visit of the mine of ore as well as an exhibition of Chinese gold and jade.

Austria took part at the founding of CIOFF in Confolens in 1970 and became an official member of CIOFF in 1974. In the year 1976 the Austrian section organized the CIOFF World Congress in Vienna and Strobl at Lake Wolfgang.

During his duty period being Austrian's delegate of CIOFF he also organized the CIOFF Central European Conference which took place in Linz in 1990. Ferdinand Sams stated his satisfaction

# New Approach to Participation Programmes 2008-2009

The current tendency for Participations programmes is related with Cultural Diversity and Cultural Intangible Heritage. The PP have more impact and chances to be selected if they emanate from a Member State Country.

CIOFF National Sections are encouraged to present their own PP through their National Commission. The idea would be to select one PP per sector. CIOFF International comprising of 6 sectors, will select 3 PP dealing with cultural diversity and 3 PP dealing with Cultural Intangible Heritage would be selected to be presented.

#### Submitting a request

For each biennium, after the definite adoption of the programme and budget, a Circular Letter is issued and sent out by the Director General to Ministers responsible for relations with UNESCO, National Commissions and Permanent Delegations, inviting them to submit their written requests under the title of the Participation Programme

It will now be for 2008-2009. (Deadline should be end of February 2008)

In Memory of Shmuel Bialik

On the 17th of June 2007 the oldest member of CIOFF, honorary Shmuel Bialik, passed away at the age of nearly 98 years.

Shmuel Bialik was the representative of Israel since the early days of CIOFF. In 1978 he organised the 4th meeting of the Executive Bureau and in 1991 the World Congress, both in his town: Haifa. He had to organise the latter on very short notice because he replaced another candidate, who resigned at the last moment. He was very relieved that in spite of the difficult situation during the cold war period most of

the member countries attended. Even the Minister of Culture of the Soviet Republic of Kirghiztan was present.

During the World Congress in Fuglsö, Denmark, in 1995 he was appointed Honorary Member. He was the first active member who received this honour. His 86th birthday was celebrated on 15 September with a huge cake. He attended his last World Congress in 1997 in Thessaloniki, Greece, where he was accompanied by his son Ami, because his health did not allow him to travel alone anymore.

People that have known him will certainly remember his humorous interventions in the congresses and above all his reaction "bla, bla, bla..." when the discussions took too long and did not result in decisions. But above all he will be remembered as the initiator of the CIOFF World Folkloriadas. Therefore he will always remain our Papa Folkloriada.

He launched the idea for a CIOFF

World Folkloriada, where groups from all the member countries could participate, at the World Congress in Haifa in 1991. In 1993 in Ireland it was decided that the 1st CIOFF World Folkloriada would be organized in Brunssum in the Netherlands in 1996. And it turned out to be a big success Luckily he could attend although his health was not very good anymore.

On the other hand he could not attend the next two: Sapporo in Japan in 2000 was too far for him and for Budapest in Hungary in 2004 he was already too weak. Nevertheless he was very proud that his idea continued to be realized.

As a tribute to him the Central European Sector will produce a selection of the three past Folkloriadas on DVD.

So he will not be forgotten...

# II . INTERNATIONAL SMILING CHILD FESTIVAL ISTANBUL 20-24 APRIL 2007

Turkish Spinal Cord Injuries Association has organized First International Smiling Child Festival with the cooperation of Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality. In the year 2006, 500 disabled and non-disabled children from 13 countries participated.



The Festival gives a unique opportunity to various countries to show how to cope with disability, by presenting cultural and historical richness to the world and the chance to give the opportunity to our disable children to express themselves. That is why Smiling Child Festival is being organized traditionally every year.

Our primary purpose of founding this organization is to help handicapped children to socialize with other children and to protect the future of them in this changing world in conjunction with the 23rd April - National Children's Day, which the great leader Ataturk has given as a gift to the children of the whole world. Our children are our future and to protect their rights is our duty.



The Turkish Association of Spinal Cord Injuries has organised the Second International Smiling Child Festival in Istanbul, Turkiye between the dates of 20-24th April 2007 for the disabled children who are 7-15 years old from all over the world with the support of the Ministery of Culture, Istanbul Government, Metropolitan Municipality of İstanbul. We invited disabled and mixed(disabled & nondisabled) children's groups that have any kind of stage performance like folklore, modern dance or talented individual children that can sing or play musical instrument or have any kind of visual work or piece of art that can be exhibited in the Festival.



The disabled children who came from various countries of the world and many cities of Turkey were hosted for a whole week in Istanbul, one of the most beautiful cities of the world. They experienced unforgettable moments in Istanbul through getting to know the Turkish culture and hospitality.

From Smiling Child Festival to the whole world, all disabled and non-disabled children will give the message of a world where all the obstacles to peace and brotherhood have been demolished.

About 1000 participants took part in 2007 in festival: 40 groups from 28 countries of the world.

The Polish Section of CIOFF recommended the small group from Integra-



tion Dance Club in Poznan of 4 couples (4 disabled and 4 non-disabled) of children dancing the Polish national dances. In each couple one child was dancing in a wheelchair. The teacher and instructor of the dance is Mrs. Jadwiga Banas.

Children are taking home unforgettable memories and impressions for friends and families. They are proud that they managed to represent Poland and themselves as well as possible through the Polish national dances and Polish cultural heritage. The came back home happy with this wonderful adventure.

Mrs Jadwiga Banas felt that she managed to fulfil children's dreams She felt also that her dream is also fulfilled as there is no more valuable treasure in the world than the smile of a child.



# **COMPETITION FOR THE OFFICIAL CIOFF MUSICAL SIGNAL (FANFARE)**

Organisations of Folklore Festivals and Folk Art announces the International COMPETITION for the official CIOFF signal.

The signal (musical code) is expected to be used in the following circumstances:

- Opening and closing ceremonies of the World Congress
- Opening and closing ceremonies of the other annual meetings of the organisation
- Opening and closing ceremonies of Folkloriada
- Opening and closing ceremonies of CIOFF Festi-
- Opening and closing ceremonies of other official **CIOFF** manifestations

The International Council of Principles of the competition:

> The signal should correspond to the following criteria:

**Duration:** between 40 and 45 seconds maximum

Style: festive music finishing into major (orchestral only) **Beginning**: in the form of a

ringing End: with panache (brio) and into major

Character: should reflect the spirit of our organisation and character of activities - Traditional Culture -

Orchestration: of an international style, corresponding to the international significance of our organisation

**Metric**: preferably binary and dynamic.

#### Regulations:

- 1. The competition is opened at all National Sections. Each National Section is allowed to present only one proposal
- 2. The competition proposal should be presented in form of score (in the case of composition) with demonstrative audio presentation (CD – DVD)
- 3. Document explaining the choice, the origin and the name of composer of the music should accompany the proposal in a closed envelope.
- 4. In the case of special composition, the composer (author) should transfer the copyrights to  $\widetilde{\text{CIOFF}}$
- 5. International jury of musicians nominated by CIOFF will evaluate the proposals and will report the conclusions to the Council.
- 6. The main reward would be presentation of the name of composer in all CIOFF publications as well as inviting composer for the first signal official public presentation
- 7. The deadline for sending the proposals is January 31st 2008.
- 8. The proposal should be addressed to the Cultural Commission of CIOFF.
